General conditions

This Schedule of Specific Commitments was elaborated taking into account the disciplines and principles of the GATS, which recognise, among other elements, the flexibility to adopt specific commitments that are differentiated in terms of sectors and modes of supply.

This Schedule of Specific Commitments shall not be interpreted as limitations of domestic regulation or to the introduction of new regulation with a view to achieving national policy objectives, in accordance with the Fourth Paragraph of the Preamble to the GATS and the main goals of the Agreement.

This Schedule of Specific Commitments is elaborated on the basis of a positive list approach and individual sectors and sub-sectors are identified in accordance with the classification list in Document MTN.GNS/W/120 of the WTO and corresponding CPC preliminary version numbers.

Where no reference is made for a specific sector or sub-sector, it should be interpreted that Brazil is not taking any commitments for that specific sector or sub-sector.

For the purposes of interpretation of Brazil's commitments, the cross-border supply of services through electronic means, including the internet, will be limited to mode 1.

Any commitments in mode 1 digitally delivered services are conditional to the other State Party sourcing at least 67% on average, in the previous 3 (three) calendar years, of its total domestic electricity production from low carbon emission energy sources¹. If, after the entry into force of the Agreement, the total domestic electricity production from that other State Party does not meet the average of at least 67% from low carbon emission energy sources in the previous 3 (three) calendar years, concessions in mode 1 digitally delivered services automatically enter into the agenda of the next Joint Committee meeting and may be suspended after such a meeting. Once the aforementioned percentage has been met again by that other State Party in a calendar year, Brazil's suspended commitments towards that State Party shall be reinstated with immediate effect. In line with the objectives of the Paris Agreement, the threshold may be increased in accordance with Article 8.19 (Modification of Schedules) of the Agreement.

The electricity production percentages will be determined according to national statistics of the State Party concerned.

Low carbon emissions energy sources include solar, wind, water (hydropower), nuclear, biomass and its derivatives, geothermal and hydrogen.

2.C. Telecommunication services

1) Cross-border supply

Modes of supply:

- (a) "Telecommunication services" means the transport of electronic magnetic signals, sound, data, image and any combination thereof, excluding broadcasting.
- (b) The Federal Constitution of Brazil guarantees all acquired rights of service suppliers already established in Brazil. Brazil reserves the right to adopt or maintain limits to foreign participation in the capital of telecommunications service providers.
- (c) All service suppliers in order to supply a telecommunication service in Brazil need to obtain a licence from Anatel. Licences shall be granted only to suppliers duly established according to Brazil's domestic laws and regulations, which requires head office and management located in the Brazilian territory, and ownership of the majority of the voting shares by natural persons resident in Brazil or companies duly established according to Brazil's domestic laws and regulations, which requires head office and management located in the Brazilian territory.
- (d) This Schedule of Specific Commitments does not include any commitment related to the activities which have their content transported by a telecommunication service. The content and treatment of those activities are regulated under the respective sectors.
- (e) Telecommunication service suppliers must use Brazilian satellites, whenever they offer technical, operational or commercial conditions equivalent to foreign satellites. A Brazilian satellite is one that uses the orbital resources and radio spectrum notified by the country to the ITU, or distributed or assigned to it, and whose control and monitoring station is installed in Brazilian territory. The use of a foreign satellite will only be permitted by contracting a company established under Brazilian law and headquartered and managed in the country, as the legal representative of the foreign operator. The regulatory decisions on this regard are based on a transparent, objective process and on a reciprocity basis.
- (f) No limits shall be applied to the quantity of licences that can be granted for the supply of telecommunications services, except in cases of technical impossibility, such as spectrum availability, or to avoid impairment to the supply of specific modalities of public interest services.
- (g) Value Added Services are not defined as telecommunication services in Brazil's domestic laws and regulations.
- (h) Suppliers of telecommunications services of collective interest established in Brazil according to Brazil's domestic laws and regulations shall have the right to use physical facilities (posts, ducts, conducts, servitudes) owned or controlled by other suppliers of telecommunications services or other services of public interest in a non-discriminatory manner and under fair and reasonable prices and conditions. The regulating agency responsible for the facilities to be used shall define the conditions for the adequate fulfilment of this provision.

- (b) Financial service suppliers shall be organised as a "sociedade anônima" (publicly-held company), unless otherwise specified.
- (c) Financial service suppliers of banking services shall be authorised by Presidential decree in order to be incorporated under Brazil's domestic laws and regulations.
- (d) Business service sellers, contractual service suppliers and independent professionals are not allowed to supply financial services in Brazil.
- (e) There are regulatory requirements for the acquisition of foreign financial services by Brazilian financial institutions
- (f) Transfer of information, including personal information, into and out of Brazil's territory by electronic or other means for the conduct of business within the scope of the license, authorisation, or registration granted by a Brazilian financial authority to a financial service supplier of an EFTA State must be undertaken in accordance with terms and conditions set forth in Brazil's domestic laws and regulations.
- (g) Financial services supplied by an offshore financial service supplier 16 are not covered by this list.

Offshore financial service supplier means a financial service supplier, set up in accordance with the domestic laws and regulations of a State Party, which is owned or controlled by non-residents of any State Party and whose activities are mostly related to non-residents, generally on a scale out of proportion to the size of the economy of the host State. - (g) Technical representatives of insurance, reinsurance and retrocession service suppliers, as well as related service suppliers, shall have permanent residency in Brazil.
- (h) Direct insurance (including co-insurance) and Insurance and Retrocession with the exception of CPC 81299 and CPC 8140 can only be provided by juridical persons.
