






- Scrutinise EFTA policies and EEA legislation
- Raise awareness of important issues
- Build a political consensus
- Advocate for the EEA in the national parliaments
- Facilitate political dialogue
 - → Meeting with EFTA Ministers
 - → Meeting with EFTA Social partners
 - → Meeting with representatives from the EEA Council and JC
 - → Meeting with Members of the European Parliament





EFTA Advisory Bodies : Consultative Committee

- Shape EFTA and EEA policies
- Influence relevant policies
- Raise awareness of important issues
- Provide forum for dialogue
 - → Meeting with EFTA Ministers
 - → Meeting with EFTA Ambassadors
 - → Meeting with EFTA parliamentarians
 - → Meeting with EU social partners

Decision shaping - definition

- An EEA EFTA invention
 - →Broadly defined in Decision Shaping Bulletin 2009:
 - Process (formal/informal) of contributing to and influencing EU policy proposals
 - ➤ Includes all EFTA- and EU institutions, NGOs etc
 - ➤ Includes legislation, broader EU policies, "soft law"
 - ➤ Includes all stages of the process
 - →Important that we are proactive/flexible since EU is constantly changing





Decision shaping - at the core of EEA EFTA Member States' priorities

- Norwegian Chair EFTA Standing Committee, Work Programme autumn 2009:
- → "Promote EEA EFTA participation in EEA-relevant EU bodies and fora"
- →"Be actively involved <u>in all stages</u> of EEA-relevant legislation and actions..."





Decision shaping – access varies as to who we are approaching

→ Commission – right to participate, but not to vote

• Art. 99 Expert groups

• Art. 100 Comitology committees

Art. 101 Other (advisory) groups

EU acts Agencies (regulatory and executive)

→ <u>European Parliament</u> – no access, but open process

→ Council – no access, but approach informally

Decision shaping - cooperate through EFTA

Why?

- EFTA is a good brand name
- EFTA Secretariat is present in Brussels
 - We follow the EU decision cycle continuously


How?

- → EEA EFTA comments:
 - Time consuming to prepare (?) easier to update
 - Efficient:
 - > Considered by the European Commission
 - ➤ Reach all EU Member States ("twice")
 - Reach selected MEPs
 - > Can be used by all, also in bilateral member state contacts



Decision shaping - access varies as to where we are in the process

Decision shaping: Best practice examples

- Some common features:
 - →Started early in the process
 - →Followed the process until final adoption
 - →Used both bilateral-/EFTA track
 - → Had both formal/informal contact





Best practice example: Food information

→30/1-08: EC adopted proposal for Regulation on provision of food information to the consumers

→30/10-08: Expert Group on Foodstuffs issued extensive EEA EFTA Comments

➤ Sent to the Commission, EP Rapporteur, FR Presidency and Council Secretariat

➤ Norway distributed them actively when in bilateral contact with EU Member States and stakeholders

 \rightarrow 03-09: Norway invited to Council WG on Foodstuffs to

present the EEA EFTA position

→12-09: Proposal is still being discussed in the Council

Working Group and in the European Parliament





Other Best practice examples

- →New European System of Financial Supervision
 - Closely followed by the EFTA States (dealt with in detail tomorrow)
- →Examples shown in EFTA Bulletin "Decision shaping in the European Economic Area"
 - Reach
 - Goods Package
 - Open Method of Coordination





Advice for effective Decision Shaping

- Be active in the process from the beginning
- Prepare well for meetings
- Establish contacts with the Commission
- Establish contacts with experts from EU States
- Focus on quality rather than quantity
- Use the EFTA Secretariat as facilitator
