





Basis for the EEA and Norway Grants

EEA Agreement – Art 115-117

... the Contracting Parties... agree on the need to reduce the **economic** and **social disparities** between their regions...

A **Financial Mechanism** shall be established in addition to the efforts already deployed by the Community in this regard






Protocol 38

Agreement between the EEA EFTA states and the EU (38c)

... Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway ("the EFTA States") shall contribute to the reduction of economic and social disparities in the European Economic Area and to the strengthening of their relations with the Beneficiary States, through financial contributions in the priority sectors...





2021 – 2028 FUNDING PERIOD

The EEA and Norway Grants combined contribution to reducing social and economic disparities in Europe is €3.268 billion in the 2021 – 2028 funding period.

EEA Grants €1.805 billion

Norway Grants €1.463 billion




Who can apply?

Only entities from the Beneficiary States can apply for funding. Entities from the Donor States can be partners.


